# **INTRODUCTION**

## **SCOPE**

This report describes an Endangered Archive Programme project that was undertaken on the remotest inhabited island in the world – Tristan da Cunha, in the South Atlantic. Situated 2,700km from South Africa and 3,700km from the nearest shores of South America, the volcanic island of Tristan da Cunha is only accessible by a seven to ten-day voyage by sea.

The objective of the project was to identify archival records pre-dating the devastating volcano eruption on Tristan da Cunha in 1961, when the whole population was evacuated to the UK for two years. In addition, the project endeavoured to gather historical documents to create one catalogue named 'Tristan da Cunha Archive and Museum Catalogue'. (see Appendix 1). Trial digitization by staff and volunteers was also to be undertaken.

## **RECORD-KEEPING ON TRISTAN DA CUNHA**

Before the present Post Office and Tourism Building was built in 2008/9 the museum was in a building which is now a residential property. The museum housed various artifacts but no documents. Most of the records were located in private residences. These consisted of collections of articles, letters, magazines, photos and some books pertaining to Tristan da Cunha. There were also some records kept in the Council Chamber of Tristan da Cunha. Before the EAP project started, there was no archive room and extraordinarily little archival work had been carried out.

## **SURVEY AND CONSOLIDATION**

The survey comprised sorting through the records which were already held with the Tourism Department and visits to the Government Administration Building where the Council Chamber is housed. A Public Notice was also issued to all residents to raise awareness to the project and requesting anyone with private collections to consider submitting them to the Tourism Office. The principal objective was to identify records that preceded the 1961 volcano eruption and to consolidate them into a single collection in a secure location.

### **SURVEY RESULTS**

#### **THE ARCHIVE ROOM**

Phase 1 of the project was to identify a place to house the archive room and have a room built and insulated. Being a relatively new building, the Post Office, Museum and Tourism Centre appeared to be the most suitable place to construct the room. In 2016 an order for building materials was placed with a company in South Africa and a further order was submitted with a UK company (*Conservation by Design*) for all the equipment and sensitive material required for the project. Due to the remoteness of the island and the lack of regular cargo vessels, this phase of the project took a year to complete. The completed archive room was fitted with shelving on 3 walls with 4 shelves along each wall. These shelves were divided into units marked A to E, starting on the left wall with Unit A and progressing round the archive room in a clockwise direction until it reached shelf E on the right hand side of the room. Each shelf was marked 1 - 4 top to bottom. (See figure 1)The documents which were already held in the Tourism Department and also some records which we acquired from the Council Chamber in the Administration

Buildings were then categorised into two main categories: Government issued documents and Non-Government records. Non-Government documents were housed in banker boxes in the archive room in Units A and B, while Government records were placed in similar boxes in Unit C. Unit D was empty and Unit E contained the external hard drive on which the digitized material is stored.

Once the secure archive was built, the second phase of the EAP project was to sort all the documents collected into categories as per the catalogue in Appendix 1.

## THE MUSEUM

Aside from the Archive Room, where the prioritised documents for digitalisation were to be stored, there was also the Museum itself. Documents and publications written after the 1961 volcano eruption were housed in a glass cabinet in the Museum (see figure 3). These records were coded MU1 for Non-Government Documents and MU2 for Government Documents. These records are also included in the catalogue (see Appendix 1).

## SCOPE OF THE ARCHIVAL RESOURCE

As previously stated, the archive materials were sorted into Government and Non-Government records. The Government records included information on some of Tristan da Cunha's government departments including Administration, Agriculture, Conservation and Public Works. Non-Government records included documents relating to Island Life and Families, Flora and Fauna and General Accounts of Tristan. Of particular interest was a collection of documents acquired from the Council Chamber of Tristan da Cunha. These records related mostly to Reverend C. P. Lawrence, who was stationed as a naval chaplain on Tristan da Cunha from 1942 – 1944 during WWII and who initiated the establishment of the fishing industry from 1947 onwards. These materials were divided into Government records headed World War II (catalogue code WW) and Non-Government records headed Legacy Reverend C. P. Lawrence (catalogue code LL). In addition, there were some documents relating to Tristan da

Cunha's history (catalogue code H) which dated as far back as 1815. Documents from these categories were selected as the focus for digitisation, although some materials from other categories were also digitised.

## **DIGITISATION**

### **DIGITISED MATERIALS**

*Series WW.* Records pertaining to World War II. These consisted of reports and documents relating to the Royal Navy and the South African Air Forces personnel stationed on Tristan da Cunha during WWII. These were dated between 1942 and 1946 and included a progress report by the advance in 1942. (See WW01. Figure 4). There were also lists of articles sent to Tristan da Cunha by the war comforts department in Durban and items given to the islanders at Easter 1944 by C.P. Lawrence. The other documents digitised in this series were letters to and from C. P. Lawrence.

*Series LL.* Legacy of C.P. Lawrence, naval chaplain (1942 -1944) and initiator of the fish factory (1947-1950) on TdC. These were private documents belonging to C. P. Lawrence, which he left behind on Tristan da Cunha. Documents in this series included an account of a trip to Nightingale in September 1942, a handwritten diary on the eve of Ascension Day 1942 and letters to islanders in October and November 1949.

A sub-series contained a selection of letters written to Reverend Lawrence by islanders of Tristan da Cunha and others.

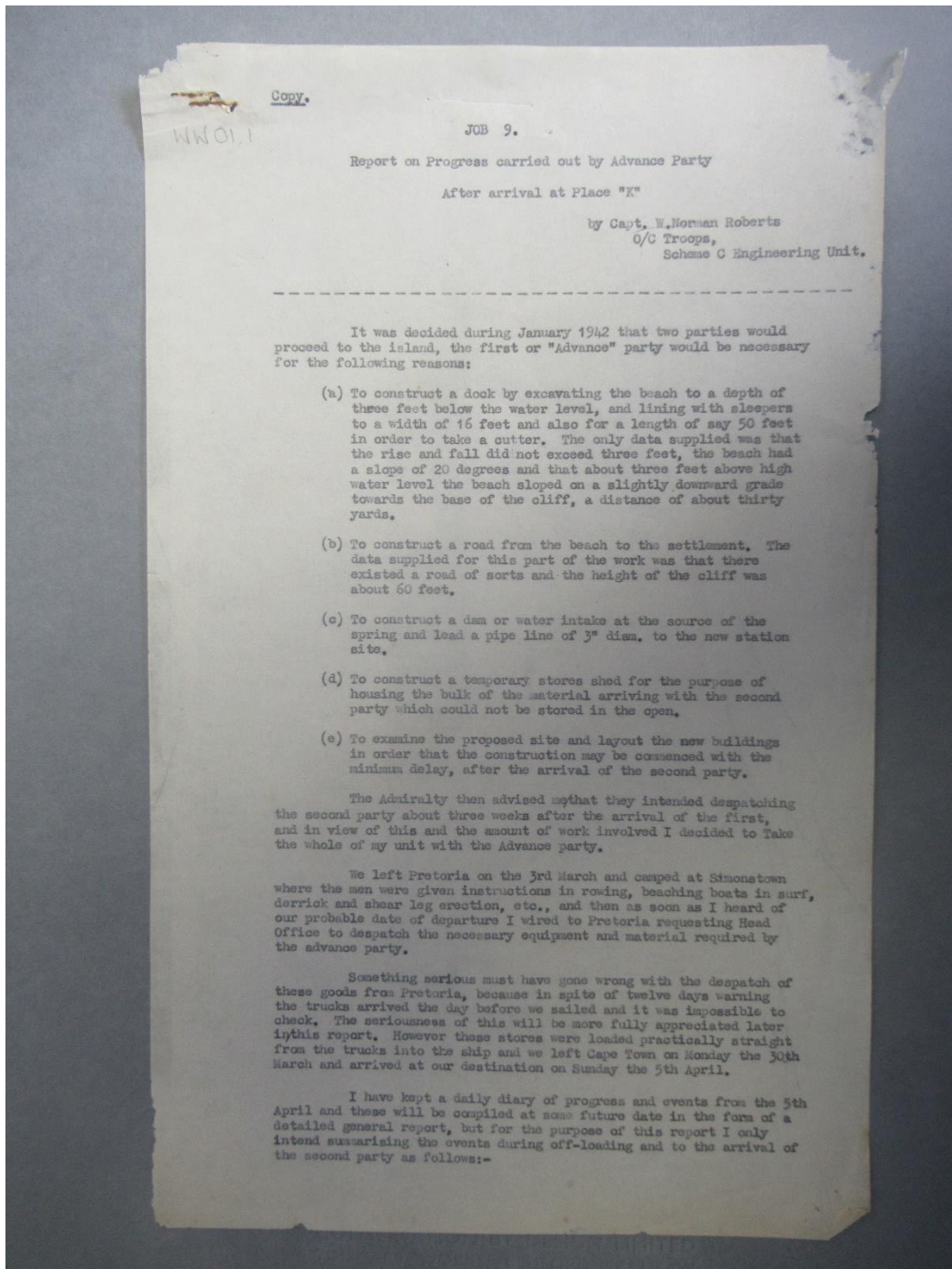


Figure 5. (H47) letter by Lt Milne

*Series H.* contained documents relating to Tristan da Cunha's history. Amongst the oldest of these documents (H47) was a letter written on the 16<sup>th</sup> of October 1815 by a Lt. Milne, R. A to the Admiralty, asking that he might establish a colony on Tristan da Cunha. The 7-page document described the island, the history of the island and the ships that passed

by. The manuscript was slightly faded with ink blotches and rust marks on the pages. (see figure 5)

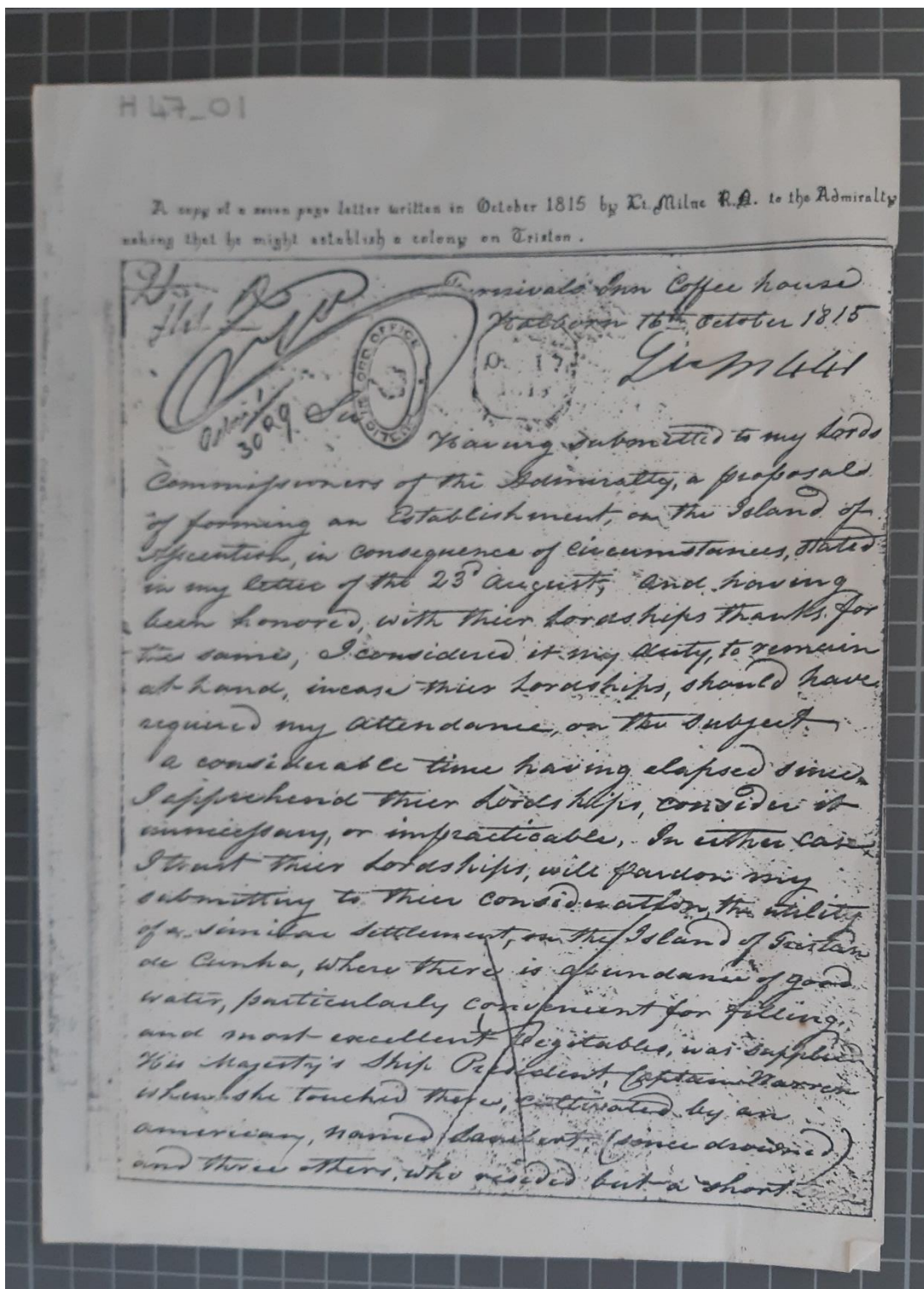


Figure 6 (H33) Letter by the Norwegian Scientific Expedition dated 1938

Another historical document of interest was a letter dated 19 March 1938 (H33) from The Norwegian Scientific Expedition to the inhabitants of Tristan da Cunha. This stipulated that materials left over from the expedition be distributed equally amongst the islanders. This document was creased and stained, so benefitted greatly from being digitised to protect the resource. (See figure 6)

## **DEPOSITION OF DATA**

The data generated by this project has been deposited at the Endangered Archives Programme, British Library, 96 Euston Road, London NW1 2 DB.

## **EQUIPMENT SPECIFICATION AND DIGITISATION PROCESS**

### **PHOTOGRAPHY**

Photography for the project was undertaken with a Canon EOS 6D camera (16 megapixel). The lighting unit was a Kaiser RS1 RB5000DL with colour checker passport. The camera was tethered to the computer via USB cable. (See figure 2).

### **SOFTWARE**

Adobe Photoshop Lightroom 6 Full Version and Checksum for Windows.

### **COMPUTER**

Unfortunately, this computer was destroyed in the storm of 2019 (see Threats below).

### **IMAGE FORMATS**

Photographs were taken in CR2 (RAW) format and exported via Lightroom as uncompressed TIFFs.

### **PROCESS**

The digitisation process used for documents was as follows:

1. Open Explorer to create a new folder in Generated Data/Images/RAW



2. Set up the camera checking image size, aperture and quality.
3. Set white balance 6.
4. In Lightroom, start tethered capture.
5. Turn on lamps, set the position of the document and check no shadow.
6. Make the tether, take the shot and break the tether.
7. Using Lightroom, stop tethered capture, rotate images 180 degrees and review images for any errors.
8. In Explorer make a new folder in Generated Data/Images/TIFF.
9. In Lightroom export to TIFF.
10. In Explorer check export for quality. Rename TIFFs in sequence and generate checksum.

## DISCUSSION AND RECOMMENDATIONS

### **SURVEY**

Only after all the documents had been gathered and sorted was the wide span of dates of the material realised. The original plan was to digitise all documents dated before the 1961 volcano eruption. These documents however, only accounted for part of the whole collection of material identified in the survey. As can be seen from the Catalogue and Inventory in Appendix 1 and 2, there is a vast array of different material. Most of this is housed in the Archive room and Museum within the Tourism Building. The remainder kept in the Council Chamber in the Administration Building.

### **PRESERVING THE PHYSICAL RESOURCE**

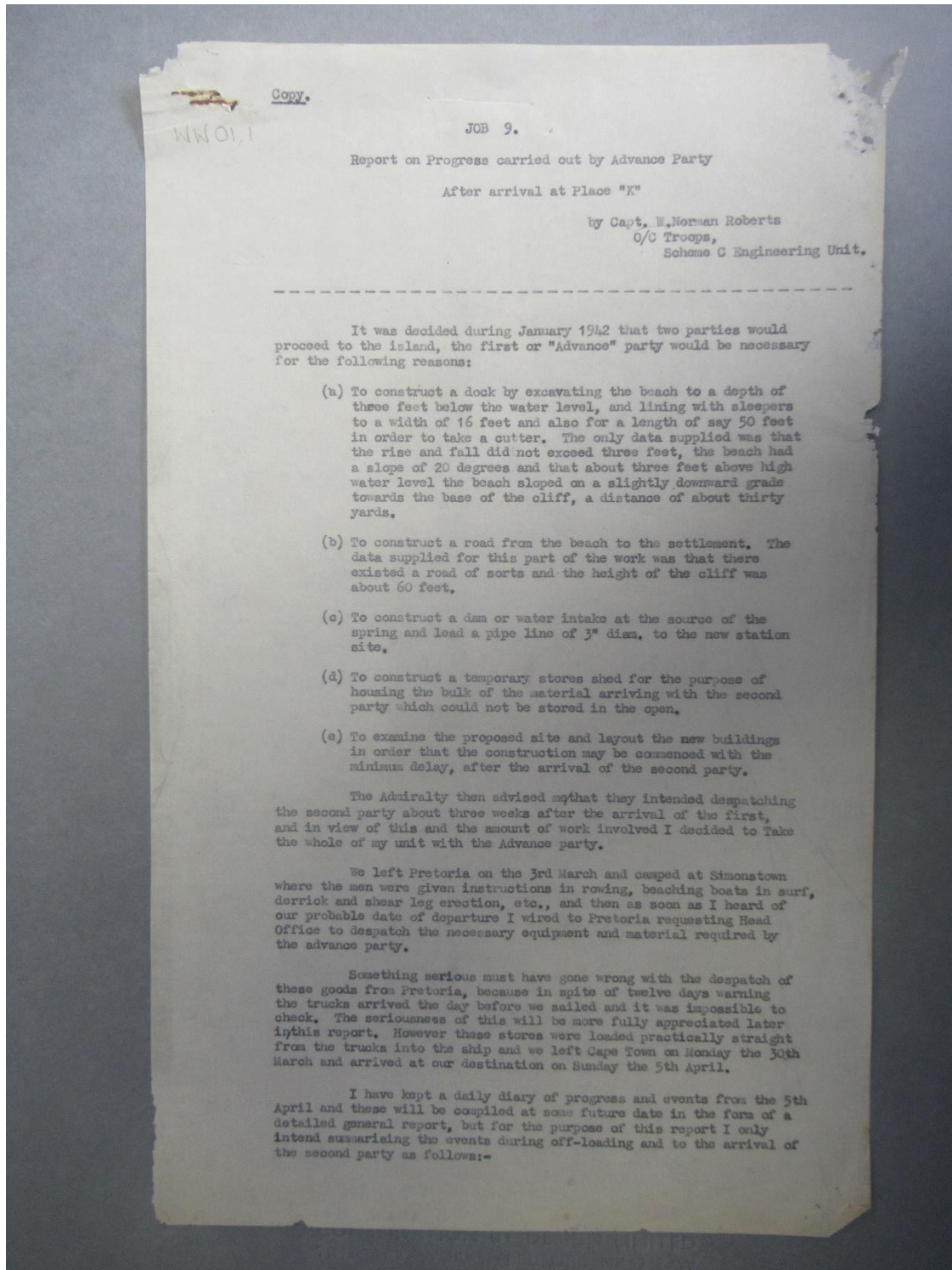




Figure 7 Photo of the Archive and Museum after the July 2019 storm

Most of the materials identified during the survey were kept at the Tourism Building. Although the building was modern with the archive room built within that building, there would always be the threat of damage, simply as a result of the island being extremely remote and exposed to extreme weather conditions. It was hoped that by building a

secure archive room, the materials would at least be protected to a certain degree. In July 2019, as a result of one single catastrophic event, the whole island was in turmoil. A storm, with hurricane strength wind gusts swept across the island causing devastation to many government buildings, including the Museum and Archive (see figure 7). Thankfully, most of the archive material was saved, but this event highlighted how endangered these archive materials are and the real need to protect them for future generations.

## **DIGITISATION**

Much, though not all of the material identified by the survey merits digitisation. All documents that are complete and written before the 1961 volcano eruption should be digitised first. As illustrated above, this was started during the trial digitisation project. Once digitised, documents were flagged on the Inventory with an 'x'. Most records which were produced after the evacuation of the islanders in 1961 are yet to be digitised. Incomplete records kept in the archive are not yet digitised. Nor are documents that have no immediate link to Tristan da Cunha, but which are stored in the archive.

## **EXTENSION TO THE EAP PROJECT**

Owing to the real threats of damage to Tristan da Cunha's historical documents, by catastrophic events such as the volcano eruption of 1961 or the 2019 storm, an extension to the EAP project would be completely justified. However, owing to limited staffing and expertise, extension funding would primarily be required to pay for an archivist to travel to Tristan da Cunha to stay and work on the project. A small fund for capital purchase would be needed for a new computer to replace the one destroyed in the storm of 2019.
